The doors of the Afro-Arts Theatre, located at 39th and Drexel, were opened on Monday, October 14, to thousands of black youth who came to stage a rally. These were the determined youth who boycotted school for that day to protest among other demands, the shortage of black teachers and the lack of comprehensive black history courses.

Although the theatre was filled to capacity, a call for attention was quickly achieved by arms being extended upward and the echos of the word Peace.

Security guards, coming from the ranks of the students, formed the frontal line as the students emerged from the theatre to begin the march from 39th Street to Martin Luther King, Jr. Drive and over to the Shabaaz where a tribute would be paid to Malcolm X. Police cars and Paddy wagons followed behind and along side of the marchers. Visibly absent were large numbers of supporting black adults; However, it was no great loss because our black youth present did their thing beautifully.
