





ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

DR. DENNIS J. KEIHN

The responsibility for building a NCAA Division I program for men's and women's athletics at Northeastern Illinois University has fallen into the capable hands of Dr. Dennis J. Keihn. After 24 years as an NAIA member school, the Golden Eagles will be competing on the NCAA Division II level for the first time in 1989-90, and moving up to Division I in the fall of 1990.

Twice in his career Keihn has brought schools back into the spotlight after many years of losing seasons. Northeastern Illinois has had many successful teams over the years, but a move up in stature needs the proper guiding hand.



Prior to Northeastern Illinois, Keihn spent six years as Athletic Director at California State University, Los Angeles. He is credited with significantly improving the retention and graduation rate of athletes. In both 1985 and 1986 he directed the NCAA National Track and Field Meet held at the school. Serving as president, he initiated the first CCAA Conference post-season basketball tournament.

He spent four years (1978-82) as Athletic Director at Macalester College in Minnesota. As head basketball coach he took a team from a 5-22 record to a conference championship in two years. He improved the football program from a NCAA record-holding losing streak (50 games) to a respectable .500 season. He established the Athletic Hall of Fame and has done the same at Northeastern Illinois this past January.

From 1973-78 he was athletic director at Inver Hills Community College in Minnesota. Once again he rebuilt the football, volleyball and softball teams from losing seasons to conference champions. He coached the schools first and only basketball team to make an appearance in the NJCAA National Tournament. His teams posted five 20 win seasons and were in the state championships four out of five years.

Keihn received his bachelor's of arts degree in Physical Education from Ball State University in 1968. His master's of science in Physical Education is from Indiana University in 1969. He received his doctorate in Physical Education/Athletic Administration from Indiana University in 1973.

Over the years he has served on several NCAA committees as well as conference, national and Olympic committees. He has been honored 10 times as Coach of the Year on several levels, and twice coached the Minnesota High School All-Star Team.

Dr. Keihn and his wife Sue reside in Palatine.

ABOUT THE GOLDEN EAGLE ATHLETIC PROGRAM

During the 1989-90 season, the Golden Eagles will be competing on the NCAA Division II level for the first time, after being a member of the NAIA since 1965. Beginning the following year the Golden Eagles will move to the Division I level and will support 12 intercollegiate teams. The school currently fields men's teams in baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, and tennis. The women's teams include basketball, softball, tennis, and volleyball. By 1990-91, the program will have added women's cross country and both men's and women's swimming and diving.

The facilities at Northeastern Illinois are the latest available with the Physical Education Complex being opened in 1988. The building houses five gymnasiums, weight room, five racquetball courts, a swimming pool, classrooms, full training facilities, and the Center for Excercise Science and Cardiac Rehabilitation Program. Also located in the lobby of the building is the newly established Athletic Wall of Fame with it's 18 charter member plaques displayed.

COACHING STAFF

HEAD COACH JULIE MORGAN

Upon entering her second year as Head Softball Coach at Northeastern Illinois University, Julie Morgan looks to improve upon the Golden Eagles 3-20 record of last season. Morgan is excited about moving up to the Division I level. "We have the people this year to definitely help us. We will be alot better than last year as long as everyone stays healthy."

Before coming to Northeastern, Morgan received her bachelor's degree in Physical Education from the University of Wisconsin - Whitewater in 1982. At UW-Whitewater, Morgan was a standout softball



player earning All Conference, and NAIA All Region honors as a centerfielder.

Morgan was a two sport athlete at Beloit Memorial High School in Wisconsin. She earned Most Valuable Player honors twice in basketball, and once in softball. She also received All-State honors in basketball as a senior.

Besides being Head Softball Coach, Morgan is the Director of Intramurals and Recreation at Northeastern.

ASST. COACH ANNETTE TRACY

Annette Tracy will be the Golden Eagles Assistant Coach for the 1990 season. For the past two seasons she has been an assistant coach to Mike Fogel on the women's basketball team.

Tracy is a 1987 graduate of Illinois Benedictine College with a degree in physical education. Prior to Illinois Benedictine, Tracy attended George Williams College for two years and North Central College for one year and participated in both basketball and softball.



During the day Tracy is a substitute teacher at Evanston High School. Before coaching at Northeastern

Illinois, Tracy was an assistant basketball coach at Glenbrook North High School in 1987.

The Chicago native is a New Trier High School graduate where she was a four year starter on the basketball team and earned all-conference and team MVP honors. As a member of the softball team as a pitcher she helped lead them to a second place finish in the state tournament.

SEASON OUTLOOK

Northeastern Illinois University head softball coach Julie Morgan has high expectations for this years team. "If we play up to our potential, I know we will definitely improve upon last years record. This would be a positive step forward and it will hopefully set a solid foundation for a prominent softball program."



Pitching will definitely be a key to the Golden Eagles success. Sharing the pitching duties will be, Sheila Malnati (Luther North H.S.), Edna Torres (Lakeview H.S.), and Tracy Ryndak (Good Council H.S.).

Returning players Kathy Wietrzykowski (Prosser H.S.), Pam Laskowski (Good Counsel H.S.), Sue Latourette (Notre Dame H.S.), and Adria Mheenbeek (Von Steuben H.S.), will be called upon to perform consistently and provide some continuity from last years program.

Tom Lake begins his first season as sports information director at Northeastern Illinois University. BETH ZIELINSKI HEAD ATHLETIC TRAINER


