#### NORTHEASTERN HISTORY

Northeastern Illinois University was founded in September, 1961, and it is located on the Northwest side of Chicago, 10 miles from the loop. At present, Northeastern is a teachers and liberal arts school with a current enrollment of approximately 9500 students.

The athletic program was initiated in 1965 under the former Athletic Director, the late Charles Kane. Northeastern is a member of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) and offers intercollegiate competition in eight sports: baseball, basketball, swimming, golf, tennis, cross country, hockey, and football.

### NORTHEASTERN BASEBALL COACH Raymond Kasper

Baseball Coach Ray Kasper is a native Chicagoan, and played baseball as a prep for Lane Technical High School. Upon graduation, he enrolled at the University of Illinois in Champaign, and played ball under Lee Eilbracht (1964, 65, 66).

Coach Kasper received his Bachelor of Science and Masters Degree in Physical Education. As a graduate teaching assistant at Illinois, Ray gained valuable experience coaching the freshman team for the '67 and '68 seasons. After graduation, he spent two years at the University of Illinois-Chicago Circle as an assistant coach under Les Miller.

Ray begins his seventh year as coach of the Eagles. In that time, he has led the team to lll victories and two NAIA playoff berths ('73 and '76). He believes in playing a tough schedule and many victories have been recorded over Big Ten schools and nationally ranked teams. Two of Coach Kasper's squads have batted over .300 (the '74 club ranked seventh nationally according to the final NAIA statistics with a .328 batting average). The '77 campaign should be a successful one, hopefully, the highlight of Ray's coaching career.

Assistant Coach Al Lamirand will again be a valuable asset to the baseball program. After a fine career as a pitcher, where he had a lifetime ERA of 2.11, Al now devotes his time to scouting and recruiting. He is instrumental in obtaining outstanding talent so that the Eagles can keep up their fine winning tradition.
