JEVELBOX 2003 2004

BOLCOM& MORRIS **SEPTEMBER 19, 2003**

Since their first performance together in 1972, Pulitzer-prize winning composer and planist William Bolcom and mezzo-soprano Joan Morris have captivated audiences across the nation and abroad. Heralded as "one of the great musical collaborations of our time" by The Boston Globe, this husband-and-wife duo is highly acclaimed for its finely gauged and vividly imagined interpretations of American popular songs. Bolcom & Morris have won a wide following with their expansive repertory, complemented by the sophisticated yet unpretentious stage presence audiences have come to expect. Champions of the American popular vocal literature, they have brought this genre to some of the most renowned venues in the United States, Canada and Europe.





THE MERLINGTRIO

OCTOBER 17, 2003

The Merling Trio was founded in 1988, and quickly established itself as a premiere ensemble. A truly international trio, it brings together musicians from Polish, Japanese, and Dutch backgrounds. The Merling Trio has been hailed as a brilliantly distinguished group endowed with remarkable gifts of communication. magnificent precision, and an impeccable blend of sound. The trio made its New York debut in Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall in 1993, and was named a finalist for the Naumburg Foundation Chamber Music Award in 1994

GARRICK OHLSSON

NOVEMBER 20, 2003

Since his triumph at the 1970 Chopin International Piano Competition, American pianist Garrick Ohlsson has established himself worldwide as a musician of extraordinary interpretive power and prodigious technical facility. Although he has long been regarded as one of the world's leading exponents of the music of Chopin, Mr. Ohlsson commands an enormous repertory which encompasses virtually the entire piano literature. A student of the late Claudio Arrau, Mr. Ohlsson has come to be noted for his masterly performances of the works of Mozart, Beethoven and Schubert. Mr. Ohlsson's concerto repertory alone is unusually wide and eclectic - ranging from Haydn and Mozart to 20th-century masters - and to date he has at his command some 80 works for piano and orchestra.



THE VERMEER OUARTET DEG

DECEMBER 19, 2003

The Vermeer Quartet returns to the NEIU Recital Hall for its fifth appearance in the Jewel Box Series. With performances in practically every major city in North America, Europe, Japan, and Australia, the Vermeer Quartet has achieved an international stature as one of the world's finest ensembles. Formed in 1969 at Marlboro, its members are originally from Israel, Germany, New York, and Nebraska, thus providing a unique blend of musical and cultural backgrounds. Dedicated teachers, the group's members have been "resident artist faculty" at Northern Illinois University since 1970. The Vermeer Quartet makes its permanent home in Chicago, where it is the resident quartet for Performing Arts Chicago.





PRAIRIEWINDS

JANUARY 16, 2004

Since their debut in 1996 at Oak Park's Frank Lloyd Wright designed Unity Temple, the Prairie Winds have captivated audiences throughout the United States. Their performances inspire concert-goers' delight, blending humor, fascinating musical information, and powerful performing into a synergetic experience that leaves audiences clamoring for more. Since 1999, the Prairie Winds have been the quintet-in-residence at the Britt Festival in Jacksonville, Oregon, and starting with the summer of 2003 they will also be in-residence at the Madeline Island Music Camp in northern Wisconsin. The individual musicians of the Prairie Winds perform as members of such world renowned companies as the Chicago Symphony Orchestra and the Lyric Opera of Chicago.

THE CHICAGO BRASSOUINTET

The Chicago Brass Quintet was formed in 1964 to promote the appreciation and enjoyment of brass chamber music through public performances, educational workshops, broadcasts, recording and commissioning of new works. The quintet has performed throughout the United States, Canada, Europe and Asia. Highlights have included guest performances for the International Trumpet Guild in New York and London, a two and half week tour of Hawaii, and performances at the Kennedy Center and West Point Academy.



BELLAVOCE

MARCH 19, 2004

Bella Voce was originally founded in 1982, under the name His Majestie's Clerkes, for the performance of English *a cappella* music of the Tudor period. The ensemble then broadened its repertory to include choral music from all eras and from around the world, while continuing its commitment to historically informed, professionally polished performances in original languages. A strong commitment to American music and to 20th-century music has been demonstrated by a number of commissions from Chicago composers.





NAZZARENO CARUSI APRIL 16, 2004

Returning to the NEIU Recital Hall, pianist Nazzareno Carusi is one of Europe's most leading artists. Born in Celano, Italy in 1968, he graduated from the L. Cherubini Conservatory of Florence, Italy. He has performed in recital and as soloist with orchestras throughout Europe and North and South America, including his debut in Carnegie Hall in April 2003. When not on tour, he serves as Professor of Chamber Music at Trieste's G. Tartini Conservatory.

MAY 21, 2004 PLAYERS

The Pilgrim Chamber Players is an ensemble of professional musicians, including a composer-in-residence, whose programs offer an exciting blend of new music and old favorites in an intimate style designed to engage the listener in the music making. Founded in 1995 as part of a chamber music series held at Pilgrim Lutheran Church in Chicago, the core members of the Pilgrim Chamber Players hold many awards for their individual achievements as musicians, and are actively involved in various aspects of the music business. While the formation of the ensemble was coincidental, the combined talent and creativity of the core members, Lisa Argiris, Julie Schmidt, Don Draganski and Carol Honigberg created a synergistic energy that took on a life of its own. The Pilgrim Chamber Players programming offers a unique blend of music, crossing the centuries as well as international borders to offer listeners music that excites the imagination and satisfies the soul.



GETTING TO THE CAMPUS

The campus is in close proximity to main roads, expressways, and rapid transit. It is bordered by Bryn Mawr (5600 N) on the north, Foster (5200 N) on the south, Kimball (3400 W) on the east, and Pulaski (4000 W) on the west.

From O'Hare International Airport, take the Kennedy Expressway (I-90) east to the Austin-Foster exit; go east on Foster to Pulaski, north on Pulaski to Bryn Mawr, and east on Bryn Mawr to the parking entrance.

From Chicago's Loop, take the Kennedy (I-90/94) north, merge with the Edens Expressway (I-94) and go north; exit at Peterson; go east on Peterson to Pulaski, south on Pulaski to Bryn Mawr, and east on Bryn Mawr to the entrance to parking.

From the east, take Lake Shore Drive south or north, exit at Foster and go west to Central Park, turn north into the main campus entrance.




PARKING
