

## **Coaching Staff**



#### **REES JOHNSON**

With two seasons under his belt at Northeastern Illinois University, Rees Johnson is set to lead the Golden Eagles into the NCAA Division I ranks. After one season as an NAIA level program and posting a 11-17 record, and another season at the NCAA Division II level and a 6-21 record, Johnson is ready to settle down and have some success in the big time

Success has been no stranger to Johnson as he has posted winning records at just about every institution he has been associated with. As a Head Coach he has a 379-205 (.649) record, and at the collegiate level he is 318-174 (.646). His two inaugural seasons at Northeastern have been anything but easy, but Johnson has slowly put together the program he wants and hopefully will fair better this season despite a tough schedule.

Prior to starting at Northeastern Illinois, Johnson spent 6 years at the University of Wisconsin-Parkside taking them to the NAIA District playoffs each year and finishing runner-up on three occasions (1982-83, 84-85, 85-86). His overall record was 111-67.

His most productive years may have come at Augsburg College (MN) where he was an incredible 91-22, taking them to the NAIA National Tournament two straight years (1979-80, 80-81). Both seasons the team was ranked in the top five in the nation, and he received Coach of the Year honors from the MIAC and NAIA District 13.

From 1976-78, Johnson was at Carroll College (WI) and posted his only losing records before coming to Northeastern Illinois. During that time his team's went 17-37.

Before moving on to the big schools, Johnson established himself as one of the top junior college coaches in Wisconsin when he spent three seasons at Wisconsin-Richland Center. His 82-10 record along with several conference and region championships is a credit to his coaching knowledge.

His first jobs as a head coach came at the high school level in both Wisconsin and Minnesota. The first being Wauzeka High School (WI) for one year, and four years at Peterson High School (MN).

Johnson had his hand in international basketball in 1978 when he coached the National Team from Bahrain and again in 1981 when he led the USA Team in the William Jones Tournament in Taipei, Taiwan.

He has been a guest instructor at the Medalist Camps as well as the Milwaukee Bucks Summer Camp. In both 1981 and 1982 he was the coach of the Minnesota High School All-Star Team. Several times he has lectured at clinics across the nation and many of his speeches have been published.


Johnson received both his bachelor's and master's degree from Winona State in 1965 and 1971 respectively. He is single and has two daughters Tina and Tiffany from a previous marriage, and currently lives in Chicago.

The Golden Eagles first year of NCAA Division I will mark the beginning of the third year that Richard A. Knar, Jr. will be an assistant coach at Northeastern Illinois University. His primary duties include recruiting in Illinois, Michigan, Wisconsin and Indiana, as well as assisting in film exchanges, advance scouting and supervising study hall.

This former University of Illinois-Chicago basketball player from 1984-87 scored 901 points and grabbed 483 rebounds after starting every game. As a junior he led the team in rebounding with a 7.5 per game average. For three consecutive years he was named to the Academic All-Conference team and was on UIC's dean's list 4 times.

Before playing at UIC, Knar spent one year under now University of Pittsburgh Coach Paul Evans at the United States Naval Academy. During that one season [1982-83] he started 12-of-26 games as a freshman and scored 108 points and pulled down 40 rebounds.

Since 1983 he has been the assistant director of the University of Wisconsin-Fond du Lac Basketball Camp. This past season he assisted at the Rees Johnson All-Star Camp

He received his bachelor's of science degree in Physical Education and also majored in Mathematics. He is married and lives on the northwest side of Chicago with his wife Theresa.

The I990-9I baksetball season will be the sixth that Thomas Trotter and Rees Johnson have spent together. This will be Trotter's third season on the Golden Eagles coaching staff. At the University of Wisconsin-Parkside, Trotter played under Johnson for one year and coached next to him for two others.

As a player at Parkside, Trotter had an injury filled career. From 1982-84 he was named team captain as the starting point guard. The four-year letterman averaged only 4.0 points per game during his career and helped lead the team to four NAIA district championships. Coming out of high school, Trotter was an all-city selection at Gage Park H.S. in Chicago after averaging 25.0 points per game and was the fourth leading scorer in the city.

His coaching career began in 1984 as an assistant at Parkside and was there until 1986 when he left to become an assistant at Whitney Young H.S. in Chicago for one year. He also spent one year at Gage Park H.S. working with the freshman, sophomore and the varsity levels. In 1988 he joined Johnson at Northeastern Illinois to help assist in the move to NCAA Division I status. He is the Golden Eagles primary recruiter in the Chicago area. He also works various parts of the Midwest and the junior college ranks.

At Parkside he received his bachelor's of science degree in Business-Labor Relations. He also has a minor in Physical Education. Trotter is single and lives in Chicago.

#### **Athletic Director**



#### DR. DENNIS J. KEIHN

After a two year process, Northeastern Illinois University has finally reached it's goal and is officially an NCAA Division I athletic program. The last few years have not been an easy road to travel as Athletic Director Dr. Dennis J. Keihn knows first hand. It has been his responsibility to guide the department through the process and begin to build it into a first class academic and athletic program.

Last year's move to Division II was just the start of what Keihn is putting into the program. He has established the Golden Eagle Scholarship Team, which is the athletic department's fund raising organization, a Wall of Fame for the alumni, several academic support systems and services, as well as many policy, procedure and operation manuals for the entire athletic, intramural and recreation department.

Twice in his career Keihn has brought schools back into the spotlight after many years of losing seasons. Northeastern Illinois has had many successful teams over the years, but a move up in stature needs the proper guiding hand.

Prior to Northeastern Illinois, Keihn spent six years as Athletic Director at California State University, Los Angeles. He is credited with significantly improving the retention and graduation rates of athletes. In both 1985 and 1986

he directed the NCAA National Track and Field Meet held at the school. Serving as president, he initiated the first CCAA Conference post-season basketball tournament.

He spent four years (1978-82) as Athletic director at Macalester College in Minnesota. As head basketball coach he took a team from a 5-22 record to a conference championship in two years. He improved the football program from a NCAA record-holding losing streak (50 games) to a respectable .500 season. He established the Athletic Hall of Fame and has done the same at Northeastern Illinois this past January.

From 1973-78 he was Athletic Director at Inver Hills Community College in Minnesota. Once again he rebuilt the football, volleyball and softball teams from losing seasons to conference champions. He coached the schools first and only basketball team to make an appearance in the NJCAA National Tournament. His teams posted five 20 win seasons and were in the state championships four out of five years.

Keihn received his bachelor's of arts degree in Physical Education from Ball State University in 1968. His master's of science in Physical Education is from Indiana University in 1969. He received his doctorate in Physical Education/Athletic Administration from Indiana University in 1973.

Over the years he has served on several NCAA committees as well as conference, national and Olympic committees. He has been honored 10 times as Coach of the Year on several levels, and twice coached the Minnesota High School All-Star Team.

Dr. Keihn and his wife Sue reside in Palatine.


#### THE UNIVERSITY
