HEAD VOLLEYBALL COACH AMY FARBER

Farber's First Season at NEIU

Amy was named NEIU's Head Volleyball Coach this summer. Farber comes to Northeastern Illinois University following four years as an assistant volleyball coach at Oklahoma University in Norman.

A Walnut Grove, Minnesota native, Farber began her coaching career with the Sooners in 1991 after completing her NCAA eligibility at Oklahoma. She received her bachelor's degree in physical education from OU in December, 1991. She earned her master's degree in sports management and behavior in the Department of Health & Sports Sciences in May of 1996.

Farber began her volleyball playing career at OU in 1988 following a red-shirt season in 1987. She was team captain in 1991 and earned All-Big Eight Conference honorable mention awards. In 1990, she led the Sooners in digs with 281 and ranked third in the Big Eight digs stats. Amy set a career-high in digs with 20 against Hofstra University in 1989.

She was a team member of the 1987 Big Eight Championship squad at Oklahoma, the only championship volleyball squad in history. The team lost in the regional finals to Illinois and just missed a trip to the Final Four. Farber also played on a USVA team that won the Silver Medal at nationals in 1995.

At Walnut Grove High School, she was a two-time Minnesota All-Stater in volleyball; a three-time all-conference selection and a two-time KNUJ Player-of-the-Year.

Farber's enthusiasm and excitement entering her first season as a Division I head coach is a big plus to the young NEIU program. "My goal as head coach here at Northeastern Illinois University is to take these young ladies to a new level of confidence, knowledge and play," said Coach Farber as practice drills opened in August. "Our goals will always be to compete for the Mid-Continent Conference championship."





ASSISTANT VOLLEYBALL COACH MICHELLE TISDALE

Michelle Tisdale joins NEIU volleyball coach Amy Farber as her assistant coach this season with the Golden Eagles. Tisdale is a Norman, Oklahoma native and played college volleyball for the Sooners (1990-95, career included a red-shirt season). Played in 198 career games for Oklahoma and was utilized in a variety of positions in the Sooner lineup.

Before relocating to Chicago this summer, Tisdale was a program coordinator in the University of Oklahoma Athletic Department. She has assisted as a clinician at volleyball camps with Coach Farber in Minnesota and was part-time coach for the Mustang, Oklahoma Club Team. She participated on the 1993-94 team that ranked number one at the National Invitational Tournament in Kansas City.

Tisdale received her Bachelors Degree in Business Administration/Marketing from Oklahoma and is actively pursuing her Masters Degree in Higher Education Administration.
