NAME OF PROGRAM: Grants to Minority Scholars for Research on Racism and Other Social Factors in Mental Health

AGENCY: Social Science Research Council

PURPOSE: Primarily for scholars from minority populations, especially American Indians, Blacks, Chicanos, and Puerto Ricans. Research projects may focus on social structures and processes or on adaptations of the individual. Factors contributing to mental health and mental illness in the individual, and in society may be examined, as well as all aspects of intervention for prevention, cure, and rehabilitation. Other appropriate topics for research include social organization for treatment of mental illness and the mental health consequences of social action to resist isolation, estrangement, or oppression.

ELIGIBILITY: Earned doctorate in a social or behavioral science, or psychiatric specialty in medicine, or demonstrated research experience equivalent to the degree. Special consideration to imaginative research proposals by younger scholars just beginning research careers.

AMOUNT OF AWARDS: Ranging up to \$10,000 --- providing for full or part-time maintenance for up to 12 months + modest amounts for clerical and technical assistance, travel, data collection, and other research expenses.

PURPOSE: To provide support for two consecutive months of full-time study or research. Proposed work may be within the applicants' special areas of interest or may be in some other field that will enable them to understand their own fields better and enlarge their competence. Project may be completed during stipend period or may be part of a long-range project.

An applicant must be nominated by the president, dean, or other designated officer of the college or university employing him/her. Three members may be nominated, selected on the basis of ability or promise as a scholar or teacher.
