NORTHEASTERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY 1987 BASEBALL OUTLOOK

The Northeastern Illinois University baseball team has a new head coach. Jim Hawrysko will guide the Golden Eagles this year after being an assistant coach for the past three years.

Hawrysko plans to improve on last year's record of 16 wins and 31 losses by improving the defense. Last year, the Eagles committed 105 errors and Hawrysko's goal is to cut the errors in half. To accomplish this, he has moved Doug Ryan (Forest View H.S.) from second base to his natural position at third base.

Two community college transfers Drew Keys (Glenbrook South H.S. and Oakton College) and Orven Colon (Schurz H.S. and Truman College) will play shortstop and second base respectively. Mitch Stern (Niles West H.S.), a two year starter, will anchor the infield at first base. The entire starting outfield is returning, led by centerfielder Blake Bartnick (Mt. Prospect H.S.), who is an excellent defensive outfielder. At catcher, Jim Knauss (Arlington H.S.), a transfer from Harper College, should give the Eagles a steady performance behind the plate.

Hawrysko is looking for more consistent performances from his pitchers. Four pitchers returning from last year's team will comprise this year's starting rotation. They are Bill Shimp (St. Viator H.S.), who had a 4.15 ERA in 43 innings last year; Mike

Altobelli (St. Patrick H.S.), who had a three win and one loss record and a 5.14 ERA, Bill Terpinas (Niles West H.S.) and Dave Lohenry (Weber H.S.). Terpinas and Lohenry are starters but neither saw too much action last year. The bullpen will be anchored by Tim Larson (East Leyden H.S.), who had six saves and a 3.02 ERA in 47 innings last year.

The offense will be paced by the three returning outfielders. Bartnick hit .318 last year, Pat Wagner (Holy Cross H.S.) hit .308 and Pat's brother Dan Wagner (Holy Cross H.S.) hit .310. Hawrysko looks for this year's team to run more because of the added speed in the infield.

This year Northeastern will open the season on the road in Florida. The Eagles will play nine games on this opening trip including games with the University of Tampa, Wayne State, Utica, Wisconsin-Milwaukee, George Washington Eckard and Bellarmine. The Eagles will then come home to face the usual tough competition in the Chicagoland Collegiate Athletic Conference.

This year's 46 game schedule also includes Northwestern,
Missouri-St. Louis, Illinois State, Wisconsin-Parkside and
Valparaiso.
