Class lists for the Fall trimester were distributed in the basement area in front of the elevators on Wednesday and Thursday of last week. All those not picked up by 3 p.m. on Thursday were placed in faculty mail boxes. Any faculty member who did not find such lists is asked to please so advise Mrs. Cook in the Record Office at once.

With the increased enrollment it is especially important that instructors check class lists carefully and send the appropriate notification the the Record Office if errors are discovered. Multiple sections of a class meeting at the same time are probably going to cause some difficulties. If a student's name does not appear on the class list, and he is attending, please send him to the Record Office immediately. He will be pointed in the right direction, and hopefully will arrive eventually in the correct class. It is not possible to provide correct grading materials, or keep accurate records without faculty cooperation. The Record Office Staff will be glad to do the leg work if the problems are reported to us.

Registration is now officially over. Students will not be permitted to register <u>under any circumstances</u>, nor will they be permitted to add classes unless they are doing do to correct an error in the original registration. They may drop classes through the sixth week of classes.

The Record Office counter will not be open before 9 a.m. this term. It will be closed between 12 noon and 1 p.m. each day, and will be open to day-students only until 4 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Civil Service Employees who plan to register as undergraduates in the Winter, 1969, trimester, should notify Miss Christensen immediately, so <u>Advance Registration</u> kits can be prepared for them. Civil Service Employees with degrees who wish to register may also request kits if they plan to take day classes. Those in this category who want evening classes only should request Mail Registration kits from Mr. Braun.
