With the increased enrollment it is especially important that instructors check class lists carefully and send the appropriate notification the the Record Office if errors are discovered. Multiple sections of a class meeting at the same time are probably going to cause some difficulties. He will be pointed in the right direction, and hopefully will arrive eventually in the correct class. It is not possible to provide correct grading materials, or keep accurate records without faculty cooperation.
