All agreed that the Liberal Arts majors need career counseling in order to more effectively find and use employment opportunities. Most have not assessed themselves and have literally no idea of employment opportunities into which they would be qualified to move.

Conferences

Mr. Speller and Mr. Johnson were participants in panel discussions in the programs offered.

On October 6, Mr. Edmund S. Cavanaugh, Dr. John F. Etten, Dr. Alfred Lazow, and Dr. Leonard A. Setze attended a conference, "The Use of Simulation as a Teacher Preparation Technique" highlighted with a presentation of an Inner-City Simulation Laboratory. The Conference was sponsored by Science Research Associates, Inc., College Department, Chicago.

Dr. Louis A.
