THE COMPARY YOU KEEP: The dark-haired man with the sparkling eyes and the unfamiliar face to be seen at rehearsals for SPEAKING OF CHARLIE is award-winning playwright DICK CAVALIER. A native of Minnesota, Cavalier graduated from the University of Minnesota and took courses at Northwestern's Graduate School of Business. Now a resident of Chicago, Dick has lived in New York City and has traveled in more than 40 countries world-wide.

The theatre of ideas is Cavalier's province. His drama, THE COURT OF ELSINGRE, examines the plight of contemporary characters who are so consumed by the preservation image that they have no sense of self. TRIAGE points the ugly probability that the third world's prennial food shortage is exacebated and prolonged by public policies based on private greed. SPEAKING OF CHARLIE argues that sexual realities must be dealt with rationally; and the resolution of the dramatic conflict of the play addresses this. Given the present AIDS crisis, the play offers a moral for our times.

Dick Cavalier is very excited about this first production of SPEAKING OF CHARLIE which is being staged by the University Theatre under the direction of Dr. David Unumb
