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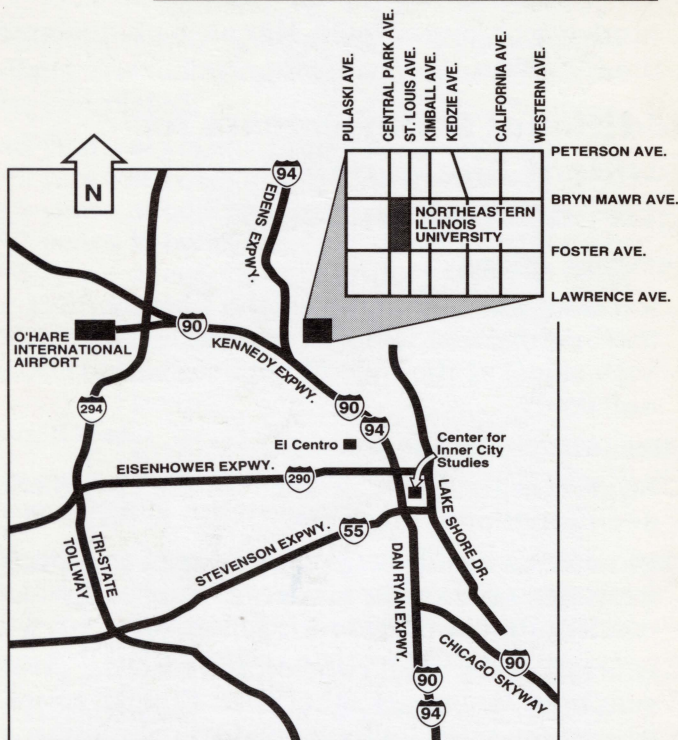

Street Guide



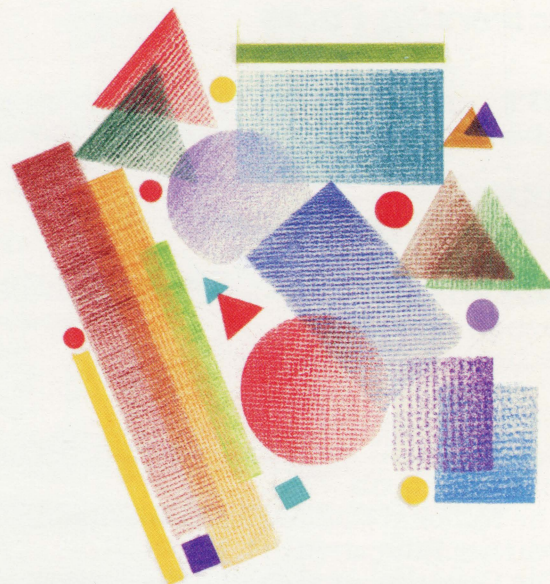
NORTHEASTERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY CAN BE REACHED EASILY:

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Transferring From A Four-Year College

A maximum of 90 semester hours may be applied towards graduation. To receive a degree from Northeastern, a student must complete the last 30 hours in residence at the university.

Most courses from other four-year institutions may be transferred to Northeastern. However, there is a 30 hour limit in certain subject areas.

Financial Aid

All applications for financial aid should be on file in the Office of Financial Aid by April 1 for priority consideration for the following September.

Financial aid transcripts from all previously attended universities/colleges must be on file in the Office of Financial Aid.

How To Apply For Financial Aid:

Applicants who wish to be considered for financial aid should complete the following form:

- The ACT Family Financial Statement (FFS) is the preferred form. The single file form from USA Funds may also be used.

Types of Aid Available:

■ **Grants** - Pell Grant, Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG)

■ **Scholarships** - Illinois Monetary Award (ISSC), Northeastern Illinois University Talent Scholarship, Special Education Scholarship, ROTC Scholarships - Air Force or Army, Private Scholarships, Graduate Tuition Waivers.

■ **Loans** - Perkins Loan (NDSL), Stafford Loan (GSL), SLS, and Plus Auxiliary Loans

■ **Student Employment** - College Work/Study Employment

■ **Veterans Benefits** - Illinois Veterans Scholarship, Illinois National Guard/Naval Militia

Freshman Admission

Requirements

1. Graduation from an accredited high school or passing grade on the General Education Development Test (GED).
2. ACT composite score of 19 or SAT score of 750 are required for all incoming freshmen unless they are 21 years of age or older.
3. Admission is based on high school rank in class and supporting ACT or SAT scores.
4. Beginning with the Spring 1988 graduating class, the following high school subjects must be completed:
 - 3 years of college preparatory English
 - 2 years of college preparatory Social Science
 - 2 years of college preparatory Mathematics
 - 2 years of college preparatory Natural Science
 - 3 years of college preparatory work in some combination of computer science, fine arts, foreign languages, or additional work in the above areas.

Procedures

1. Submit completed application for admission to the Office of Admissions.
2. Students should have their official GED scores or high school transcript reflecting sixth semester rank in class and ACT or SAT scores sent directly to the Office of Admissions.
3. Veterans must submit a photocopy of their DD214.
4. Students on a visa must submit a photocopy of the I-94 form.

Transfer Admission

Requirements

1. Overall "C" average in all coursework attempted and good academic standing at the last school attended full-time.
2. Students with less than 30 semester hours of college credit must also meet freshman requirements.

Procedures

1. Submit a completed application for admission to the Office of Admissions.
2. Request that official transcripts from each college or university attended be sent directly to the Office of Admissions.
3. Students with less than 30 semester hours of college credit must also request an official high school transcript and ACT or SAT scores.
4. Veterans must submit a photocopy of their DD214.
5. Students on a visa must submit a photocopy of the I-94 form.

Additional Requirements for Resident Aliens and International Students

Resident Aliens

1. Resident aliens must submit a photocopy of their permanent resident status card (I-551 both sides) at the time of application to the university.

International Students

1. Student with an F-1 or J-1 visa are classified as International Students.
2. In addition to meeting requirements for either freshmen or transfer students, International Students must provide the following:
 - a. Official copies of all educational records. Transcripts in languages other than English must be accompanied by a certified translation service.
 - b. Northeastern Illinois University Financial Statement and supporting bank or employer's letter.
 - c. Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) score with a minimum of 500.

Transferring to Northeastern

Transferring From A Two-Year College

A maximum of 60 semester hours of credit will transfer from a two-year college. Additional credit hours taken beyond 60 hours will not be counted towards hours earned for graduation.
