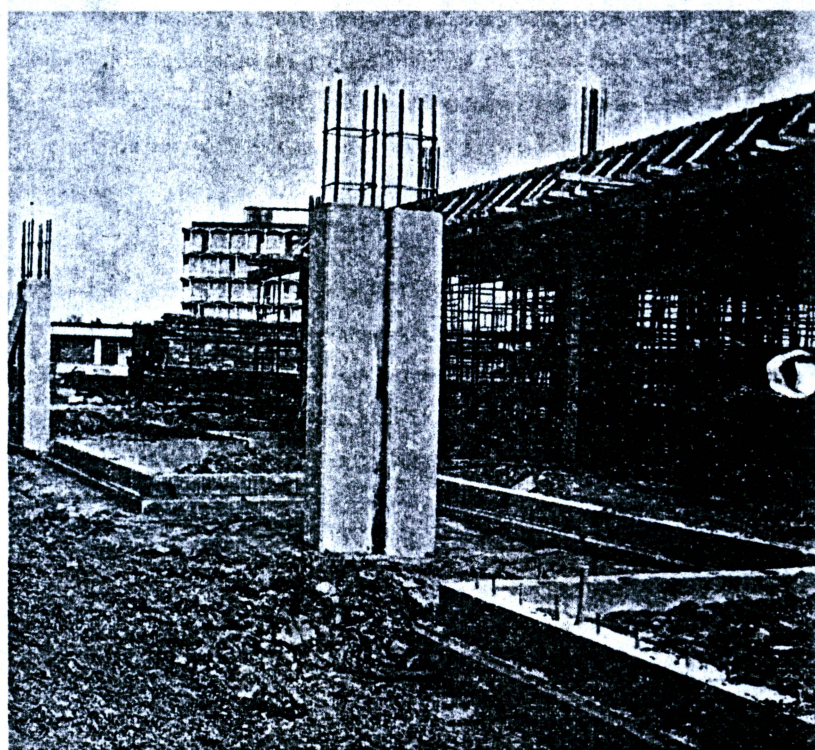


## KUZHARA RECEIVES JOHNSON AWARD

Daniel Kuzahara, assistant professor of Psychology, was the recipient of this year's Johnson Foundation Award for distinguished teaching at Northeastern. The award is made based on criteria established by a faculty committee as well as results obtained by polling senior NISC students. Mr. Kuzahara joined the faculty at Northeastern in 1965 after receiving his M.A. from the University of Chicago.

## CAMPUS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM BEGINS . . .

Recent ground breaking ceremonies marked the first phase of construction for the new Science Building at Northeastern Illinois State College. A three-story structure, the building will contain faculty offices, 31 classrooms, 7 seminar and conference rooms, and 36 laboratories and preparation rooms for the departments of Physical Sciences (Chemistry, Physics, Earth Science), Biological Sciences, Psychology and Mathematics. This welcome addition will allow for increased student enrollment as well as more space for the latest laboratory equipment. Completion is expected at the end of December 1971. Future plans also include a high-rise parking structure and classroom building.

As predicted last spring, the Board of Governors passed a resolution on Sept. 10 altering the title of our institution. Our new title will be Northeastern Illinois University (NEIU). This change coincides with the physical expansion that our institution is now undergoing. Admittedly this change must be approved by the State Legislature, however, this seems to be a mere formality. By early 1971 the name change should be finalized, and the students here will finally receive the benefits of graduating from a state university. Perhaps we will now begin to see these greater benefits materialize.
