# Two Cub games for two bucks—each

The programing department of Northeastern has arranged to get box seat tickets for two Chicago Cubs baseball games at reduced prices for students; one game in June, the other in July.

#### A play



### Credit union insures savings

The Northeastern Illinois Federal Credit Union now carries federal insurance of members' share accounts (up to \$20,000 each). This insurance is similar to the kind of insurance available to banks and savings and loans organizations. The NIFCU, which is made up of faculty and staff, has current assets in excess of \$16,000 and hopes to be able to expand its loan granting activities by issuing automobile loans in the near future. The interest rate charged by the credit union is one percent of the unpaid balance per month, which is considerably lower than any rate currently available from a bank or loan company. Faculty and staff members who are not already members of the credit union can join with an initial deposit of as little as \$5.25. Payroll deductions are available and, in fact, members are saving over \$3000 each month via payroll deductions.
