The drug addiction problem is becoming the top socio-health issue on Capitol Hill. Representative Paul Rogers (Dem. Fla.), House Health Committee Chairman, pushing a bill to establish 300 treatment centers at the cost of \$160 million. (AMA news - June 21, 1971) Reminds one of an old adage: "An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure".

World Health Organization (WHO) is preparing and urging new differential cigarette tax, hitting hardest on the brands with high nicotine and tar content.

Profiteering by physicians under New York's liberal abortion law is charged in the Wall Street Journal. A physician is quoted as saying that there are large numbers of doctors performing abortions who are easily making \$100,000 to \$150,000 EXTRA a year. Womens' lib quip: "We don't see any quotes of figures on income to doctors from performing vasectomies."

Cosmetic scandal: National Committee on Product Safety says that more than 60,000 women a year suffer adverse effects from cosmetics severe enough for them to seek medical care. Cases range from mild discomfort to serious disfigurement. A chief culprit - fingernail hardeners. Advise: Keep nails clipped.
