

WIRELESS ACCESS IN THE LIBRARY

The Ronald Williams Library recently joined the growing list of "hot spots" on campus with the addition of several new wireless access points. This will support the growing number of faculty, staff and students who want to be able to check email or search the web from a wireless-enabled laptop computer while studying without the need to head for a Starbucks or Borders. At present, only the third and four floors of the Ronald Williams Library have been upgraded to support wireless access. Network cabling is now also in place on the remaining three floors of the Library for installation of additional wireless access points on these floors later this year when funds are available.

The process for connecting to the wireless network in the Library is identical to settings needed to connect to other existing wireless "hot spots" on campus. Both secure and unsecure connectivity is supported using standard 802.11b/g protocols. For users new to wireless access, detailed information is provided in the Documentation section of the Student Computing Services website (www.neiu.edu/scs).
