Anyone and Everyone!! Auditions for Eugene Ionesco's KILLING GAME will be held December 5th and 6th in the Stage Center at 6:30 PM each evening. The director, DAN TORBICA, has said that no prepared monologues will be required. The audition will be in the form of a read-through of the script each evening, Therefore it is to the benefit of the auditioners to be present at 6:30 sharp in order to get the desired role to read. A large company will be formed from the auditions. There are many roles available. Dan is looking to cast up to 18 actors of various sizes, shapes and abilities. He is looking for good and weird character actors. NO EXPERIENCE NECESSARY.

A reminder: Performance dates for KILLING GAME--March 31, April 1, 5, 6, 7, and 8 at 7:30PM.

The third production of the 1988-89 Season will be Noel Coward's HAY FEVER. Kat Matassarini will direct. Because of the emphasis upon language in Coward's script, Kat will conduct a pre-audition workshop for voice development, and will cast HAY FEVER from the workshop participants. Don't forget the remaining four performances for the excellent production of Georg Kaiser's FROM MORN TILL MIDNIGHT, November 30 and December 1, 2 and 3 at 7:30PM in the Stage Center.

Talent scholarships are available to qualified persons for the winter trimester. Applicants need not be Speech and Performing Arts majors, but an interest and knowledge of things theatrical is necessary. Applications are available from Mr. Hesler, Mr. Redd and Marilyn Mueller in the Speech office on the 6th floor of the Beehive.

There has been an increasing problem with theft in the F-Wing this fall, particularly of Lobby display items--over a dozen photos stolen, one of the pieces from the MORN TILL MIDNIGHT exhibit.
