My Sister Eileen

If you are looking for some lighter fare in you entertainment this summer, students, faculty and community members alike need not go very far. Northeastern's Summer Theater will produce two comedies, *My Sister Eileen* and *Hay Fever*.

The first production to kick off the summer theatre season is My Sister Eileen, a play written by Joseph A. Fields and Jerome Chodorov. It is based on a series of short stories by author Ruth McKenney. McKenney's autobiographical stories were originally published in The New Yorker then later collected and published as the book My Sister Eileen in 1938. It would later spawn adaptations on stage, screen and radio.

The story revolves around two sisters from Ohio, Ruth and Eileen, and their misadventures while sharing a basement apartment in Greenwich Village. Older, wiser and acerbic Ruth, dreams of becoming a great writer, while the younger, more beautiful Eileen aspires to become an actress.

Although they have big dreams while living in the big city, their career aspirations are complicated by an array of colorful characters, relationships, melees and constant jolts from subway construction.

Directed by Anna Antaramian, the production will debut at 7:30 p.m. on June 10-12, 17-19, 24-26 at the Stage Center Theatre.
