Welcome to the 1989-90 school year and theatrical season!!! Several changes have occurred in the Stage Center over the summer months-- the installation of a new state-of-the-arts lighting control system and a new sound system, the expansion of the scene shop in F110 and the installation of a new inter-com system. These additions and changes will enhance the production facilities of the Stage Center.

The first production of the 1989-90 season will be the world premiere of Dan LaMorte's SUCH IS LIFE, winner of the second annual RONALD WILLIAMS PLAYWRIGHTING COMPETITION. Dr. James Barushok will direct, Robert G. Smith will design the sets and lighting and Darice DaMata-Geiger the costumes.

Auditions for SUCH IS LIFE will be held September 11 and 12 at 7:00-9:30 PM in the Stage Center. Dr. Barushok would like a 2-4 minute prepared solo scene to demonstrate acting ability. Persons not having a prepared scene will be asked to read from the script. There are 5 women and 4 men in the cast, members of an American/Italian family. Performances of SUCH IS LIFE will be November 8-11 and 15-18 at 7:30 PM in the Stage Center.

The second production of the fall will be a University Theatre SHOWCASE directed by Richard Hesler, with December 6-9 performance dates in the Stage Center.
