A ten-line bank of recorded messages at the university's main number (583-4050) will provide callers with information on cancellations of specific campus events. However, even this newer telephone system is unable to handle a flood of early-morning calls from each of Northeastern's more than 11,000 students, faculty, and staff members.

The university encourages all faculty and staff members and students with later classes to listen to the radio or call the university switchboard after 10:00 a.m. If members of the university community only wish to know if school is cancelled, they are asked to listen to the radio.
