Soyoung Kee, pianist, graduated from the Eastman School of Music with high distinction in piano performance. At Eastman she was a recipient of Special and Endowed awards including the Martha B. Stone Scholarship, and the Jose Schaniz Scholarships. Soon after, she completed a Master of Music degree followed by an Artist Diploma at Indiana University in Bloomington. Ms. Kee's studies have taken her as far abroad as the Gnessin Conservatory in Moscow. Some of her distinguished list of teachers includes Emilio del Rosario, Alan Chow, Nelita True, Lev Vlassenko, Leonard Hokanson, and Panayis Lyras.

At age twelve, Soyoung played the Beethoven Concerto No. 4 with the West Suburban Symphony and has also performed with the Indiana Philharmonic, Northwestern Symphony Orchestra, Hyde Park Chamber Orchestra, the DuPage Symphony, and the Elmhurst Symphony. Some of her recent awards include: 1st Place at the Society of Musicians Young Artist Competition, winner of the Cliff Dwellers Young Artist Competition, 1st Place winner of the Farwell Musicians Club of Women Awards, 1st Place at the Union League Scholarship Competition, 2nd Place at the Performers of Connecticut Young Artist Competition, Clara Wells Scholarship Competition, Kankakee Valley Symphony Young Artist Competition, Lima Symphony Young Artist Competition, Northwestern University Concerto Competition and the Indiana University Concerto Competition.

Ms. Kee was recently selected to participate in the Naumburg International Piano competition to be held in June 2002 in New York. (Established in 1926, the Naumburg International competitions have been described by the *New York Times* as "in its quiet way the most prestigious of them all."

Presently, Soyoung Kee is on the faculty at Elmhurst College and is pursuing a doctoral degree at Northwestern University.
