They said it couldn't be done - reducing Fydor Dostoyevsky's 500 page classic novel to 90 minutes of playing time. In collaboration with my director, I've fought against the stiff formality of the language to create an exciting, highly dramatic, theatrical experience. Basically, this is an inner city fory - the story of one struggling student in a stile world - a story we can all relate to.
