### Que Ondee Sola Budget Approved At Last !

On September 15, 1982, the budget of Que Ondee Sola was finally passed by the Fees and Allocation Committee. Every year, the process of passing the budgets of Que Ondee Sola, the Union for Puerto Rican Students (U.P.R.S) and of the Sociology Club is a painstaking experience. The issue of these student organizations being too "political" always interferes with the process.

On September 15th, during the Fees and Allocation Committee meeting, the issue of mailing copies of Que Ondee Sola to political prisoners in the U.S. momentarily deterred the Committee of its assigned task, which is to pass budgets. If it were not for the presence

of Walter William, Director of Student Activities and Ken Petropoulos (Fees President) diligent direction, the budget of Que Ondee Sola would have been the topic of political debate and not of budgetary review. Of course, Que Ondee Sola representatives were present to defend its budget at the Fees and Allocation Committee meeting, but if it were not for the two individuals previously mentioned, the budgetary process would have been more troublesome.
