As part of the university's Presidential Seminar series, Archbishop Francis Cardinal George will speak at Northeastern Illinois University (NEIU) on Wednesday, September 23 at 11:00 a.m. in the university's Auditorium. The Cardinal will meet with Northeastern Illinois President, Salme H. Steinberg, and receive a tour of the campus during his visit.

A native of Chicago's northwest side, Cardinal George was ordained a priest of the Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate. The Pope appointed him Archbishop of Chicago following the death of Joseph Cardinal Bernardin, and elevated him to the College of Cardinals in February of 1998.

Cardinal George dedicates much of his time to the cause of unity among Chicago's culturally diverse population. Named the most diverse university in the Midwest by *U.S. News & World Report*, Northeastern Illinois is a model of cultural diversity with more than forty separate ethnic groups represented among its student population alone.



1998 ILLINOIS READING COUNCIL HALL OF FAME AWARD PRESENTED TO NORTHEASTERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY PROFESSOR MARGARET A. RICHEK

Margaret A. Richek, Ph.D., professor of reading and coordinator of Northeastern Illinois University's (NEIU) Reading Center for the past several years, was recently awarded the 1998 Illinois Reading Council Hall of Fame Award. This prestigious award was presented to Richek for her outstanding work in the field of reading education and her service to the Illinois Reading Council in editing the *Illinois Reading Council Journal*.

Prior to Richek's efforts, the journal was a small-sized plain publication. As editor, she has enlarged it and introduced a new cover featuring the artwork of Illinois elementary school students. The journal contains stories, often culturally relevant, written by children. One issue, for example, contained a story written in Spanish with an English translation beside it.

Richek was largely responsible for the development of the NEIU Reading Center which serves children with reading disabilities. Staffed by graduate students enrolled in the reading masters' degree program, the Center provides tutoring and activities for children, as well as instruction for parents to help them work with their children at home.

RECENTLY RELEASED "SPORTS AND THE AMERICAN JEW" IS EDITED BY NEIU PROFESSOR OF HISTORY STEVEN A. RIESS

"Sports and the American Jew," edited by Northeastern Illinois University (NEIU)

Professor of History, and noted author on the history of sports in America, Steven A. Riess,

Ph.D., has recently been released.

With a comprehensive overview introduction written by Reiss, the book examines the contributions of Jewish men and women to American sports in a collection of essays written by some of today's leading sports historians. The book debunks the conventional stereotype that Jews and sports are somehow anathema, and demonstrates that sports have long been a significant institution in Jewish American life.

Among the chapter titles are "Our Crowd at Play: The Elite Jewish Country Club in the 1920's," "Hank Greenberg: The Jewish American Sports Hero," "Jewish American Women, Jewish Organizations and Sports 1880-1940," and "Tough Jews: The Jewish American Boxing Experience, 1890-1950."

Some of the celebrated athletes discussed in the book are Hank Greenberg, Marty

Glickman, Barney Ross, Benny Leonard, Red Holzman, Ted "Kid" Lewis, Maxie Rosenbloom,

Abe Attell and Lillian Copelan. The publisher is Syracuse University Press, Syracuse, New York.

"MAMBO KINGS" AUTHOR APPEARS AT NORTHEASTERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY OSCAR HIJUELOS TO TALK FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 25 AT 7:30 PM

Oscar Hijuelos, winner of the Pulitzer Prize for his novel, *The Mambo Kings Play Songs of Love*, will talk about "Fiction and Reality" at Northeastern Illinois University on Friday, September 25 at 7:30 p.m. in the university's Auditorium. A Q&A session and reception follows.

Hijuelos was born to Cuban immigrants in 1951 on the Upper West Side of New York City, a neighborhood which continues to influence and shape his writing. His first novel, *Our House in the Last World*, received the Rome Prize of the American Academy of Arts and Letters, and garnered him both a National Endowment for the Arts and an Ingram-Merrill fellowship.

The fellowships allowed him to concentrate on writing his second novel, *The Mambo Kings*, which received the 1990 Pulitzer Prize for Fiction and became a national and international bestseller.

Of his third novel, *The Fourteen Sisters of Emilio Montez O'Brien*, also a national bestseller, the <u>Chicago Tribune</u> wrote: "Nobody writes about sensuality, nostalgia, and matters of the heart more exuberantly than Oscar Hijuelos." His latest novel, *Mr. Ives' Christmas*, tells the story of a successful and deeply religious man whose life is shattered by the murder of his teenage son.

FIRST AMERICAN TO RECEIVE CHINESE CULTURE RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP IS

NORTHEASTERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY HISTORY PROFESSOR ANDREW EISENBERG

Northeastern Illinois University Professor Andrew Eisenberg is the first American to receive a Chinese Culture Research Fellowship from the China Scholarship Council of the Ministry of Education of the People's Republic of China. Eisenberg is researching Wu Zetain, China's only female emperor, and the politics surrounding the imperial succession during the early Tang period (618-755 A.D.).

The China Culture Research Fellowship, established in 1993, invites history and social science scholars to conduct research in China, creating a broader international understanding of Chinese culture.

To date, the China Scholarship Council has awarded thirty-two international scholarships.

Eisenberg began his academic career with his appointment as an Assistant Professor of History at Northeastern Illinois University in 1991.
