NEIU ALUMNA IS CHICAGO'S ONLY RECIPIENT OF SPECIAL TEACHER CERTIFICATION IN 1999

Christine Fransen, a math teacher at Senn Metropolitan Academy, was the only Chicago school teacher in 1999 to be certified in Adolescent and Young Adulthood Mathematics from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS).

The NBPTS is a Michigan-based, nonprofit organization dedicated to improving student learning nationally through the creation and promotion of standards of excellence in the teaching profession. Certification is awarded on a voluntary basis to experienced teachers whose skills and knowledge meet NBPTS's rigorous standards.

Fransen, an NEIU graduate (M.S. Mathematics, 1971) who has been teaching for over 30 years, was certified in November 1999 and was one of only four teachers in Illinois to receive NBPTS certification in her area of concentration. Since 1977 she has been a member of Ensemble Español Spanish Dance Theater, in residence at NEIU, and currently serves as stage manager for the company.

Brad Baker, Northeastern Illinois University librarian and the OCLC (Online Computer Library Center) Users Council president for 1998/99, summed up the final Users Council meeting for the 1998/99 program year in Dublin, Ohio by saying, "We rolled up our sleeves and worked five days into three." OCLC is an Ohio-based, international nonprofit membership organization dedicated to promoting computer library services and research internationally, whose objective is to provide reliable and affordable access to the world's bibliographic, abstract, and full-text information.

The final Users Council program meeting under the 1998/99 theme of "Digital Library Futures: Libraries, OCLC and New Modes of Cooperation," focused on the best practices for building digital libraries, emphasizing the necessity of organizing and unifying myriad Web resources. "This year of exploring 'Digital Library Futures' most definitely underscored the strategic role that OCLC must serve on behalf of libraries, consortia and regional networks," said Baker. "OCLC has positioned itself well in its strategic plans to help libraries provide digital library services and thrive in this new environment."

NEIU FACULTY TO EXPAND MULTI-CULTURAL AWARENESS

A six-member team from Northeastern Illinois University (NEIU) was selected as one of forty college and university groups to participate in a national two-year diversity-awareness project—"Boundaries and Borderlands III: The Search for Recognition and Community in America"—sponsored by the Association of American Colleges and Universities (AAC&U).

Dr. Hoda Mahmoudi, Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, will head the NEIU team of faculty and administrators as they participate in numerous lectures and workshops designed to deepen the intellectual and curricular frameworks for higher education faculty. (This July, Brown University will host the ten-day summer institute that will mark the beginning of the project.) The goal of "Boundaries and Borderlands" is to help institutions form new curricula aimed at assisting students in developing new capacities for democratic citizenship as well as tolerance to negotiate multiple communities and commitments in contemporary America. The core of the project will be a series of eight, three-hour seminars examining the social and political implications of a growing multi-cultural U.S. population. Such sessions as "Education: The Making of Citizens," "Race and Racialization: The Color of Democracy," and "The U.S. Democratic Experiment: Forging a Nation for Whom?" represent the seminars' general theme of

promoting an enhanced understanding of an increasingly pluralistic nation.

The project will also include colloquia with nationally known speakers, an American Writers Series, and sundry cultural events. Participants will be networked via a national listserv and through online town meetings offered over the DiversityWeb.

The AAC&U is a national association founded in 1915 and devoted to the advancement of liberal education for all college students, regardless of academic specialization.

NEIU PROFESSOR RECEIVES SECOND FULBRIGHT GRANT TO RESEARCH CRIME AND THE JAMAICAN CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM

Bernard D. Headley, Ph.D., Professor of Criminology and Criminal Justice at Northeastern Illinois University (NEIU), has been awarded his second Senior Fulbright Scholar Award in six years. The grant will enable him to lecture and conduct research at the University of the West Indies in Kingston, Jamaica, from August 2000 to January 2001.

Headley will teach a course in Comparative Criminology while beginning a two-year research project on restorative justice. The project will test the fundamental assumptions of peacemaking criminology (developed by criminologists in the U.S. and Canada in the 1980s and early 1990s)—those assumptions being that the repercussions of criminal acts should be viewed as violations of community values and not just violations of state/federal laws; prevention and psychological healing should in turn be a collaborative effort between offender, victim, and the larger community. Headley will work with groups of murder convicts who will be released, in stages, back into society from Jamaica's death row (following judicial reviews that came at the end of an elaborate appeals process). In addition he will work with victims' families and wider representational communities in order to effect degrees of reconciliation and offender reintegration.

While lecturing at the University of the West Indies on his first Fulbright award (1993-95), Headley was a consultant to various governmental and non-governmental agencies interested (as a result of overcrowding in Jamaican maximum security facilities) in areas of his work involving sentencing alternatives. A past chair of NEIU's Department of Sociology, Criminal Justice and Social Work, Headley has taught criminal justice courses at NEIU since 1983. He is the author of *The Atlanta Youth Murders and the Politics of Race* (1998), and *The Jamaican Crime Scene:* A Perspective (1996), in addition to many articles. He received his Ph.D. and M.A. from Howard University, and his B.A. from Andrews University.

Headley was one of approximately 750 U.S. faculty and professionals this year to receive Fulbright grants to lecture or conduct research abroad. The Fulbright Scholar Program was established in 1946 under Congressional legislation for the purpose of increasing mutual understanding between the people of the United States and people of other countries.
