## **POPULAR MEDIA**

Jeanne Baxter, Educational Foundations, described partnerships with Local School Councils on Chicago cable's "Accentuate the Positive." WMAQ-TV covered Sociologist Martha Thompson's Model Mugging course graduation on their 5:00 p.m. newscast, and the class was headlined in the Indianapolis Star; she also contributed to a Lincolnwood Life article on single mothers. Ed Hunt, Special Education, commented on child care in a Tribune story. His Summer Institute for gifted children got media coverage when they hosted visiting Soviet junior high schoolers.

Lerner newspapers turned to Demetria Iazzetto, University Without Walls, for her expertise on eating disorders and women's self image. Lerner's Times group of newspapers featured the creative Polish cooking of Josephine Hasiuk, University Relations secretary. Lorn Coleman, Placement Director, guested on WGN-TV's "Minority Business Report," talking about job strategies." Suburban cable systems featured Dean of Students Kipp Hassell discussing our Partners in Prevention drug and alcohol education program. Ron Panzer, Biology instructor and manager of our Markham Prairie, appeared on WBBM-TV news after the discovery of a rare moth on a nearby prairie. His colleague Bob

Betz was interviewed by <u>Sun-Times</u> sports columnist John Husar on natural areas.

Freelance art critic/writer Joyce Hanson, who doubles as a secretary in Physics, was on "American Art Forum" on Channel 20. Samuel Betances, Sociology, received photo/feature

attention in a New York Times story on human relations training. English chair Jerry Howard, was quoted in a Tribune article on teaching critical thinking. English professor Ely



Liebow has been interviewed for numerous articles on his specialty, Sherlock Holmes, in recent months.

Jerry Olson, Associate Dean of the College of Education, is quoted frequently on education reform issues: a recent example is an article in the Sun-Times on how to pick a school for your children. Bob Starks, Center for Inner City Studies (CICS), is another faculty member who's frequently quoted or appears on TV, for instance, speaking about South Africa on WMAQ-TV's "Warner" show and on "Crossfire." CICS's Conrad Worrill is the subject of an article in Dollars and Sense. Geography chair Barbara Winston was featured in a North Shore Magazine column


by Susan Appel-Bass of the College of Education dean's staff. The Center for Exercise Science and Cardiac Rehabilitation keeps popping up in the media: Director George Lesmes hit the WBBM-TV news with a story on cross-training, and Center staff also provided information to the media on hot weather survival for stories on U.S. troops in Saudi Arabia.

Pop culture expert Fred MacDonald was cited in an issue of <u>U.S. News and World Report</u> and is featured in a new weekly TV show on WMAQ-TV. Charlie Shabica, Earth Science chair, wrote an op-ed piece for the <u>Tribune</u> on Loyola's lakefront landfill project being cancelled. Ever since Music's Elyse Mach won the BOG Distinguished Professor Award, media have been calling about her; for instance, the <u>Sun-Times</u> and Lerner newspapers have interviewed her.

University Librarian Brad Baker explained our Illinois archives collection on WBEZ's "Artistic License." Lerner papers and the Sun-Times covered International Day, interviewing Gary Bevington, Linguistics and International/Intercultural Studies, Battista Galassi, acting dean, College of Arts and Sciences, Flora Llacuna, coordinator, Student Enrichment Programs, and Angelina Pedroso, Foreign Languages and Literatures. BOG staff are syndicating radio feeds throughout the state featuring faculty from the five BOG schools. The first three interviews were with our Asad Husain, Political Science, Ed Robinson, College of Education, and Ed Stuart, Economics.

### PROFESSIONAL PUBLICATIONS

Economics chair **Ed Stuart** is also published in professional and trade journals on a regular basis. Two recent examples are a quote in the



August Futures, the Magazine of Commodities and Options, and an article he wrote for the Journal of Cultural Economics on

literature's portrayal of Russian economics. Joe Kallas, assistant director of the Commuter Center, had an article on vending programs in the Colleges Services Administration journal. Professor Emeritus Roger Charlier, Earth Science, has published five books and papers on coastal matters in the past couple of years and continues research in Africa, Europe and Asia. Colleague H.D. Upadhyay had a paper published by the Geological Society of America.
