September 15, 1981:

3. Original and a copy of your written statement for oral testimony. While the written statement can be as detailed and as lengthy as necessary to tell your story, for your oral presentation--because of time limits--summarize the important features of your testimony: for individual witnesses, not to exceed two (2) double-space, type written pages; for organizations, four to five (4 to 5) pages.

Please send the required materials to the Commission to the attention of Dr. Tom Taketa. If the materials are not received on or before September 9, 1981, you will not be scheduled to testify.
